Urgent Health and Safety reminder

We have been informed by the contractors who are currently working on site that an adult (with a young child) walked through their site compound as a short cut whilst vehicles were moving around. This is a polite reminder that the building site is a no-go area for the duration of the works. Thankfully on this occasion no-one was hurt.

Ordering School meals

We are unfortunately having more and more children who do not have a packed lunch from home and no dinner has been ordered on IpayImpact. On Monday this week, there were several children where we had to provide a meal unexpectedly. The kitchen is not able to cook high quantities of 'spare' food to prevent waste. When the food runs out, we will have to call home to ask that someone can bring some lunch into school for their child.

Please ensure you order meals for children if required (especially if your child is eligible for free school meals) or send them with a packed lunch from home and ensure all meals required are ordered no later than 10pm on Sundays as the week ahead will be locked from this point.

Football outside reception

Whilst it is nice to see the children playing with their school friends outside reception before school, can we please ask parents to not allow their children to play football. There have been several children who have been hit by the ball who are not playing within the game. We also need to be careful with the ball hitting our reception windows and new dining hall windows. If this does continue, we will have no choice but to ban footballs coming into school. Thank you for your support with this.

Roadworks on Watnall Road

With the road works starting next week, please keep this in mind when bringing your children to school. The works will see a section of Watnall Road closed either partly or fully during the work period, from Monday, July 15th until December 20th. The section of road in question runs from its junction with the A611 Hucknall Bypass to its junction with Nabbs Lane. The closures are to allow groundworks specialists C3 Construction to reconstruct the existing footway and carriageway as part of development works along the section of road, which is where housing and, ultimately, a new Lidl supermarket will be built on the site of the old Hucknall Town FC ground.

In the first phase, Watnall Road will be closed 24 hours a day to northeast-bound traffic from July 15th to November 11th. The second phase will see the road closed, again for 24 hours a day, to south-west-bound traffic from November 14th to December 9th. The final phase will see the whole road closed from 8pm to 6am each day from December 9th to 14th, with final works being completed by December 20th. During the closure periods, a diversion route will run from Hucknall Bypass along Wood Lane, Common Lane and Nabbs Lane, and vice-versa.

Year 5/6 Production – Robin Hood

Libraries in Nottinghamshire are looking forward to a summer filled with reading and creativity as the Summer Reading Challenge returns this July. Produced by The Reading Agency and run in libraries across the country, the Summer Reading Challenge is a brilliant way to maintain children's reading enthusiasm throughout the summer break.

Children are challenged to read six library books over the summer collecting rewards ...including smelly stickers.... along the way. Every child who completes the challenge will receive a certificate and medal. Children choose the books they want to read; story books, fact books, poetry, joke books –all reading counts!

Message from the Local Authority

It can be hard to know what local support is out there for special, educational needs and disabilities and how to access it.



A visual map has been created to help, by sharing information on services, funding, etc. Its purpose is to illustrate what is available from 0-25 years old across education, health and care agencies.

It is currently a working draft covering the 0-7 age range, which we are gathering feedback to inform the full 0-25 version.

If you would like to be involved in an online feedback session for the local authorities' new Graduated Approach Map, please contact the school office with your name and preferred meeting time. The meetings are up to an hour on TEAMS with Jennie Hallam (who works with some of our pupils to gain pupil voices) and her colleague Sophie (Project Officer) to verbally feedback their thoughts on the map. They would really appreciate the opportunity to talk through this with parents and carers.
