Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

Giving every child the best possible start

Our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) provides a nurturing, stimulating and joyful start to school life. We recognise that the early years are a crucial time for development - a period when children's curiosity, imagination and social skills flourish.

At Edgewood Primary School, our EYFS setting includes both nursery and Reception classes, each designed to offer children a safe and inspiring environment where they can learn through exploration and play.

Our approach

We follow the **Early Years Foundation Stage Framework**, which is built around the following seven areas of learning and development:

Prime Areas:

Communication and Language – developing speaking, listening, and understanding skills.

Physical Development – building strength, coordination, and confidence through active play.

Personal, Social, and Emotional Development – nurturing independence, self-regulation, and relationships.

Specific Areas:

Literacy – developing early reading and writing skills through stories, phonics, and mark-making.

Mathematics – exploring numbers, patterns, and shapes in real-life contexts.

Understanding the World – encouraging curiosity about nature, people, and places.

Expressive Arts and Design – fostering creativity through music, art, and imaginative play.

Learning Through Play

Play is at the heart of everything we do in EYFS. Our highly skilled staff use play as a vehicle for learning — observing, questioning, and extending children's thinking to develop their knowledge and confidence.

Both indoor and outdoor learning spaces are carefully designed to promote independence, cooperation, and problem-solving. Children are encouraged to take risks in a safe environment and to learn from their experiences.

Strong Partnerships with Families

We know that children learn best when parents and educators work together. We value the vital role families play in their child's development and keep parents closely involved through regular communication, workshops, and open events.

Our EYFS team ensures that every child's progress is tracked and celebrated, helping each individual to move seamlessly into Key Stage 1 as confident, enthusiastic learners.



Transition from EYFS to Key Stage 1

Building confidence, continuity and curiosity

The transition from Reception to Year 1 is an exciting milestone in each child's learning journey. At Edgewood Primary School, we place great emphasis on making this transition smooth, positive, and carefully supported.

Our KS1 teachers work closely with the EYFS team to ensure that every child's learning style, interests, and needs are well understood. The first term in KS1 continues to reflect the principles of the Early Years curriculum — maintaining elements of play-based learning alongside more structured lessons.

Children are gradually introduced to new routines and expectations, ensuring they feel secure and confident as they take their next steps. Parents are kept fully informed and involved, with transition meetings and opportunities to discuss each child's progress and wellbeing.

By the end of this process, our pupils are ready to embrace the full breadth of the Key Stage 1 curriculum with enthusiasm and self-belief.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Inclusion

At Edgewood Primary School, inclusion is at the heart of everything we do. We believe that all children have the right to a high-quality education that meets their individual needs and helps them to thrive — academically, socially, and emotionally.

We are proud to be an inclusive school that celebrates diversity and ensures that every pupil can access learning and participate fully in school life.

Our SEND Provision

Our **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) team**, led by the school's **SENCO**, works closely with teachers, parents, and external professionals to identify and support children who may need additional help.

Support may include:

Targeted interventions.

Small group or one-to-one support.

Personalised learning plans and provision maps.

Specialist input from external agencies (such as speech and language therapists or educational psychologists).

We also provide strong support for children with social, emotional, or communication needs, ensuring they feel understood, confident and part of the school community.

Safeguarding and Wellbeing

Safe, happy, and cared for — every day

The safety and wellbeing of our pupils are our highest priorities. We are committed to providing a secure, caring environment where all children can learn, grow, and succeed.

Our staff are fully trained in safeguarding and child protection, and we have clear procedures in place to ensure that children are protected from harm. Every adult in our school community — from teachers to volunteers — shares responsibility for keeping our pupils safe.

We promote emotional wellbeing through:

- · A caring and consistent pastoral support system.
- Designated Safeguarding and Mental Health Leads.
- Anti-bullying initiatives and peer support programmes.
- Opportunities for pupils to talk about their feelings and seek help when needed.

At Edgewood Primary School, children know they are listened to, respected and valued. Our school ethos ensures that wellbeing is not an addition to learning — it is part of everything we do.



Curriculum

Our curriculum is broad, balanced, and enriched with real-world experiences. It meets the requirements of the National Curriculum while reflecting the interests and needs of our children.

We aim to develop confident readers, articulate writers, curious scientists and thoughtful citizens.

Highlights include:

- A strong focus on reading and phonics through Early Years and Key Stage 1.
- Engaging, inquiry-led topics across all year groups.
- Outdoor learning.
- A commitment to sports and physical wellbeing.

Beyond the classroom

We offer a wide range of extracurricular activities and enrichment opportunities, including:

- After-school clubs and sports teams.
- Educational visits and residential trips.
- Eco and gardening projects.
- School council and pupil leadership roles, including House Captains, Sports Captains and Kindness Ambassadors
