## Cloth, Thread and Paint


### Focus Artist

Alice Kettle is a contemporary textile/fibre artist based in the UK. Alice originally trained as a painter and will often begin her work with a painted background which she then embroiders on. Her large scale work is composed of individual tiny stitches, which combine to form great swathes of colour, painterly backgrounds incorporating rich hues.



### Medium used

Calico fabric  
Paint  
Thread



### Key vocabulary

Composition	Composition is the way in which different elements of an artwork are combined or arranged.
Landscape	Landscape paintings show us natural scenery like mountains, buildings, and other views outside.
Hue	Pure colour (no white, black, grey or another colour mixed with it) or the <i>dominant</i> pure colour in the colour that is being discussed.
Shade	A <b>shade</b> is where an artist adds black to a colour to darken it down.
Dilution	To make a colour weaker or thinner by adding more liquid, usually more water.
Tint	A <b>tint</b> is where an artist adds a colour to white to create a lighter version of the colour. Pink is a tint created by adding white to red.
Stitch	The movement of a needle and thread through cloth or other material when sewing
Texture	How something feels, including its appearance and consistency.

In this unit you will explore colour, mark making and composition to create a piece of art combining paint and sewing.
